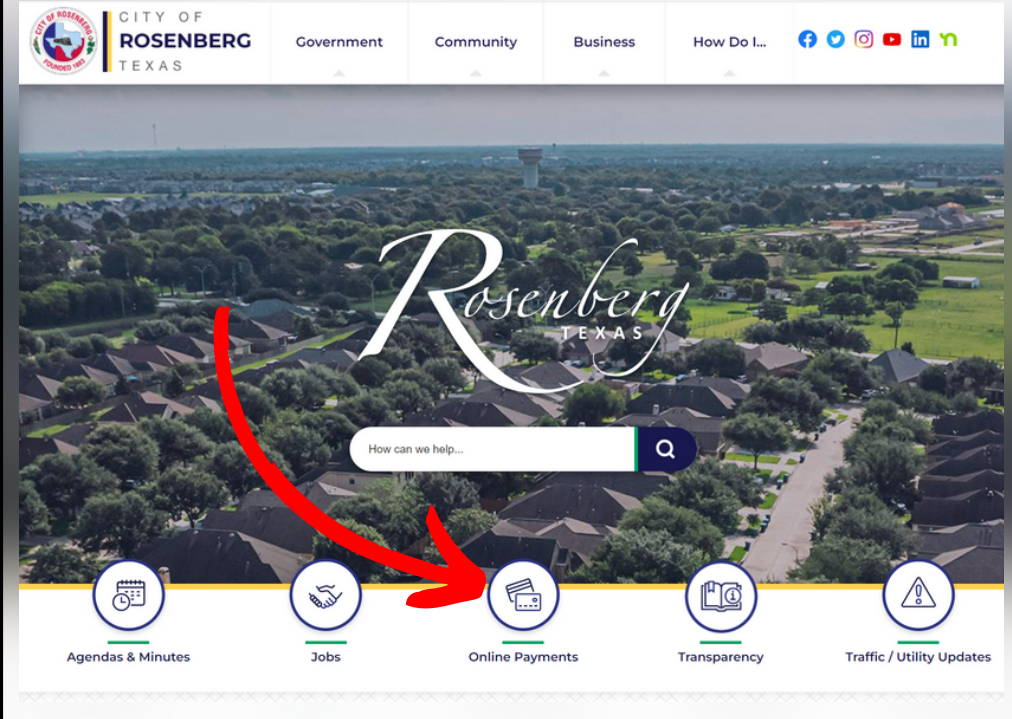


UTILITY BILL PAYMENTS

SPRING CLEANING?

If the days getting longer and temperatures slowly rising have you ready to start spring cleaning and decluttering around your home, don't forget:

BULKY TRASH IS COLLECTED WEEKLY

- Bulky trash is collected on your first service date of each week (Monday or Tuesday)
- Construction materials will not be serviced.
- Bulky pickup is heavier or larger items that do not fit in the trash container.
- Overflow or extra trash is not considered "bulky item" trash and will not be picked up.
- Up to 5 cubic yards per collection day.
