Meeting Cancellations: The Oct. 7 Council meeting was canceled for National Night Out; the Nov. 25 Workshop meeting was canceled for the Thanksgiving holiday; and the Dec. 23 Workshop meeting was canceled for the Christmas holiday.

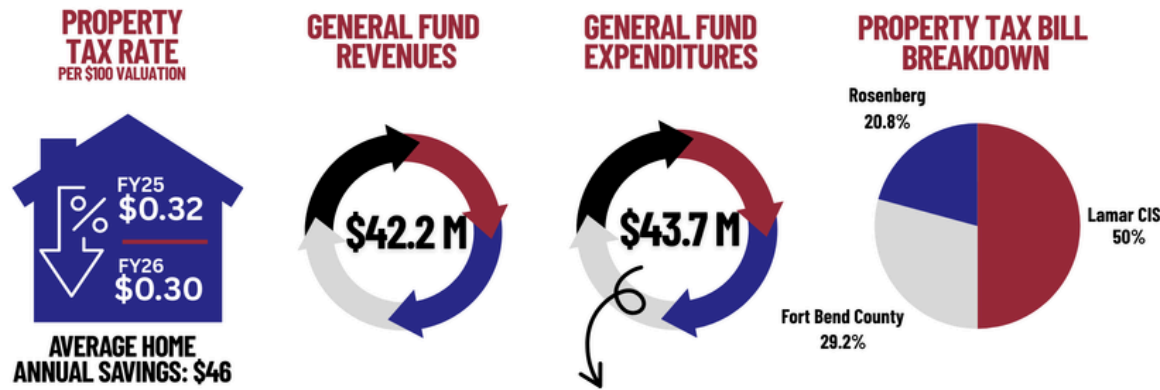
Budget & Tax Rate: Council adopted the FY 2025-2026 budget and set a tax rate of \$0.30 per \$100 valuation for Tax Year 2025, with \$0.18298 allocated to maintenance and operations and \$0.11702 to debt service. See graphic at right for more details!

- Resolutions & Ordinances:** Approved multiple resolutions, including:
- Funding for right-of-way mowing services (R-3948 & R-3949)
 - A one-year facility use agreement with Rosenberg Futbol Club (R-3950)
 - Approval of annual expenses exceeding \$100,000 for FY 2026 (R-3951)
 - Appointment of a reserve police officer (R-3954)

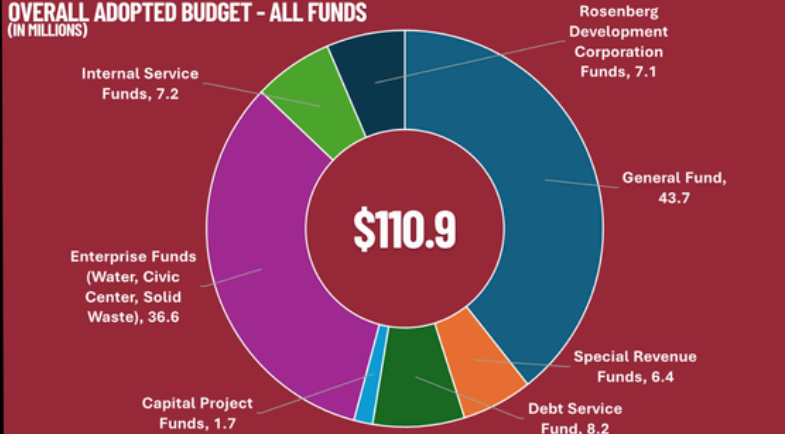

REMINDER! Solid waste collection rates increased Oct. 1st

Effective Oct. 1, 2025, residential and commercial garbage rates increased. The new rates will be \$18.89 for residents under 65 and \$16.30 for residents 65 and over.

The subsidence fee will increase \$0.20/per 1,000 gallons.

There is no increase to the water and wastewater rates.

ROSENBERG DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

RDC FY 2025-2026 BUDGET ADOPTED

On September 2, 2025, the City Council adopted Rosenberg’s budget for the next fiscal year, which includes the Rosenberg Development Corporation’s annual budget. The RDC, funded by a one-half cent sales tax allocation, is reinvesting \$5.5 million in projects in the next fiscal year benefitting quality of life for residents and commercial growth. Some projects planned for next year include:

- Continued development and operation of bus routes through Richmond and Rosenberg by Fort Bend Transit at a cost of \$75,000 per year.
- Various improvements to enhance the City of Rosenberg’s public park facilities and for improvements to Seabourne Creek Nature Park by the Coastal Prairie Chapter of the Texas Master Naturalists. The estimated amount is \$100,000 per year.
- Assist the City with replacement and construction of new sidewalks in designated commercial corridors within the City limits. The estimated amount is \$150,000.
- Assist the City with the purchase and installation of LED lighting for playing fields at Sunset Park. The estimated amount is \$225,000.
- Assist the City with construction of the Seabourne Creek Regional Sports Complex FM 2218 entrance road project, suitable as an infrastructure improvement project. An additional amount of \$400,000 is added to the project.
- Direct incentives to prospective businesses that meet certain criteria, suitable for the creation of primary jobs. The estimated amount is \$500,000 per year.
- Creation of a Site Readiness Program, necessary to preserve and prepare suitable sites and develop necessary infrastructure connections desirable for future commercial development. The estimated amount is \$500,000.
- Assist the City with the extension of water and sanitary sewer utilities along the I-69 corridor necessary for future commercial development with an additional amount of \$1 million for the project.
- Revitalization of the Highway 90A corridor from the Richmond city limits westerly to the Triple Fork area, suitable as project to promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises that create or retain primary jobs. The estimated amount is \$1 million.
- Assist the City with the design and construction of additional improvements in the Seabourne Creek Regional Sports Complex. The estimated amount is \$1.5 million.
