GENERAL AND SPECIAL ELECTIONS SET FOR MAY 2!

The City of Rosenberg will hold a General Election and two Special Elections on Saturday, May 2, 2026. This election will be a pivotal moment for the residents of Rosenberg, as they can vote for seven City Council positions including Mayor, Councilor At-Large 1, Councilor At-Large 2 and Council Members for Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4; a Special Election for charter amendments; and a Special Election to create a Rosenberg Crime Control and Prevention District funded by reducing the sales tax allocated to the Rosenberg Development Corporation.

Susan Kroll Euton

Susan Kroll Euton was born and raised in Rosenberg, Texas. Her grandfather, John W. Oberhoff, served as tax collector for Lamar CISD in the 1960's. Her mother, Marcie Kroll, served as a 4th grade teacher and elementary school councilor for LCISD for 34 years. Her father, Ervin Kroll, served the police, fire & ambulance services as a 2-way radio technician and later started Kroll's Marine in the 1970's.

Susan is a graduate of Lamar CISD. She also received a BA in Business and Economics as well as a MA in Accounting from Rice University. Susan is also a licensed Certified Public Accountant (CPA). She and her husband Charlie have run the family business, Kroll's Marine, since 1986. They have been married 44 years. They raised 3 boys and are the proud grandparents of 11 grandchildren. Charlie and Susan semi-retired from Kroll's Marine in 2022.

Susan has served on city council in several positions over the years. First, she served as Councilor At Large #1 2009-2011. Next, she served as District 2 Councilor from 2013 to 2018. Most recently, she served as Mayor Pro Tem and District 2 Councilor 2022 - 2024.

Susan has also served in numerous committees and organizations such as RDC, Finance and Audit Committees, Professional Services Engineering Project Review Committee, Charter Review Committee, Church Treasurer and Stewardship Committee.

William "Bill" Benton

William "Bill" Benton was first elected to the Rosenberg City Council as Councilor At-Large 1, serving from 2011 to 2017. He was next elected Mayor, serving from 2017 to 2019, re-elected Mayor for the 2019-2021 term, and again elected to serve as Mayor from May 2024 through 2026.

Benton is self-employed and operates several companies, including Benton Limousine, ABC Bonding, Benton Realty, and Rose-Rich Realty. He earned an Associate's degree from Wharton County Junior College and a Bachelor's degree from the University of Houston.

During his tenure in public service, Bill has served on numerous municipal and regional committees, including the Houston-Galveston Area Council, the Rosenberg Development Corporation, Finance and Audit Committees, Image Committee, Hotel Occupancy Tax Evaluation Committee, Temporary Crime Control and Prevention Board, Planning Committee, Sign Review Task Force (Chair), and the Professional Service/Engineering Project Review Committee.

He is also active in several community and civic organizations, including VFW Post 3903 Auxiliary, Sons of Hermann, WoodmenLife, Hispanics Offering People Education, Czech Heritage Society, Rosenberg Lions Club, Fort Bend County Fair, Fort Bend Historical Commission and others.

City of Rosenberg Calls Two Special Elections for May 2, 2026
Creation of a Crime Control & Prevention District and Five Charter Amendments on the Ballot

The City of Rosenberg has called two special elections for Saturday, May 2, 2026, to be held alongside the City's general election.

- The two special elections will ask voters to consider:
- **Proposition A | Crime Control and Prevention District:**
 - The creation of a Crime Control and Prevention District
 - Adoption of a local sales tax rate of 0.25% to fund crime control and prevention programs
 - Reduction of the sales tax currently levied for the Rosenberg Development Corporation from 0.50% to 0.25% in order to maintain the same overall sales and use tax rate within the city
 - **Home Rule Charter Amendments**
 - **Proposed Amendment 1 – Compensation**
 - If approved, would increase the maximum monthly compensation for City Council members from \$400 to \$600 and for the Mayor from \$500 to \$700.
 - **Proposed Amendment 2 – Comprehensive Plan**
 - If approved, would remove the requirement that City Council adopt, implement, and review a comprehensive plan.
 - **Proposed Amendment 3 – Benefits**
 - If approved, would allow City Council members to participate in the City's group health insurance plan on the same terms as full-time City employees.
 - **Proposed Amendment 4 – Recall, Initiative, and Referendum Petitions**
 - If approved, would eliminate the requirement to file a Notice of Intent with the City Secretary prior to circulating a petition for recall, initiative, or referendum.
 - **Proposed Amendment 5 – Certificates of Obligation**
 - If approved, would require a unanimous vote of the entire City Council to authorize the issuance of Certificates of Obligation.

Residents are encouraged to follow the City's social media pages for important dates, key information, answers to frequently asked questions, polling place locations, early voting options and a preview of what will appear on the ballot.

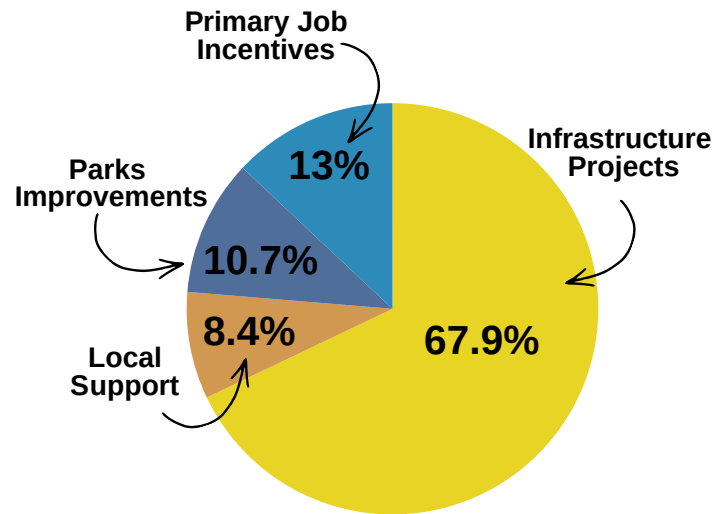
RDC INVESTS IN #RCOMMUNITY

The Rosenberg Development Corporation (RDC) turns a half-cent sales tax into major wins for our community. This portion of every local sales tax dollar funds some of the City's biggest investments which attract jobs, build infrastructure, and enhance quality of life.

In the last 5 years, the RDC has delivered strong results by funding important projects. Over half of RDC funding, 68%, goes to infrastructure projects such as critical road expansions, interchange improvements, drainage upgrades, sidewalks and water/wastewater extensions that improve commutes, safety and business access citywide.

Remaining project funds have gone to primary job incentives and community enhancements that help attract employers with well-paying jobs (with benefits) in manufacturing, logistics, and distribution; to upgrading parks, green spaces, trails, and recreational areas; and to supporting dedicated bus routes via Fort Bend Transit for residents' essential travel to medical appointments, school, work, and more. These efforts have attracted millions in private investment, generated new sales tax revenue, created lasting jobs, and made Rosenberg a more desirable place to live, work, and grow.

The RDC is smart stewardship of your tax dollars: every half-penny compounds into roads we drive, jobs we hold, and parks we enjoy.
