RECYCLING & TRASH SERVICES:

Republic Services continues to work to address the challenges faced to services during COVID-19. Please see the service updates below:

- BULKY WASTE:** Beginning Tuesday, April 28 bulky waste pick-up will resume. Do not place bulky items at the curb until this collection date.
- RECYCLING:** Beginning Wednesday, May 6 recycling pick-up resumes. On May 6 your recycle cart should only contain recyclable items. It can no longer be used for regular household trash. Visit rosenbergtx.gov/recycling for more information on proper recycling.
- GREEN WASTE:** Service as usual on Mondays. Some pick-ups may be slightly delayed, but will be picked up throughout the week.

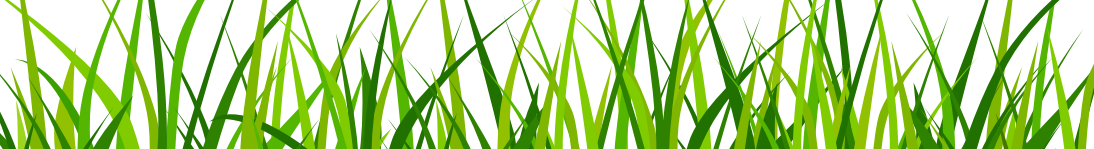
City Council voted to change the name of Bryan Road to Old Bryan Road on the small stretch of road between FM 2218 and the newly constructed Bryan Road.
