EGG-cellent Time For an Easter Egg Hunt

On your mark, get set, GO! The annual Rosenberg Easter Egg Hunt at Seabourne Creek Park will take place on Saturday, March 24, 2018 starting at 10:00 a.m.

The BYOB (Bring your Own Basket) event is free for children up to 12 years of age and kicks off with the arrival of the Easter Bunny, who has hidden hundreds of eggs at the park. Parents are encouraged to bring their cameras and take advantage of the opportunity to get photos with the Easter Bunny.

The egg hunt will be divided into four age groups: babies, children ages four and under, 5-8, and 9-12. All children will search for the colored eggs in their own respective areas.

Eggs are filled with candy and trinkets, and some may even find a coupon donated by Whataburger, Another Time Soda Fountain and Cafe, and Ol' Main Street Bakery for sweet treats. Many of the eggs were donated, adding a rainbow of color to the green grass of Seabourne Creek Park.

"There's more eggs than I could even imagine," Parks and Recreation Program Coordinator Carrie Kmiec said. "I would say, there are thousands!"

In addition to the egg hunt, there will be a raffle with prizes and chalk drawing station. Don't miss an EGG-cellent time out at Seabourne Creek.

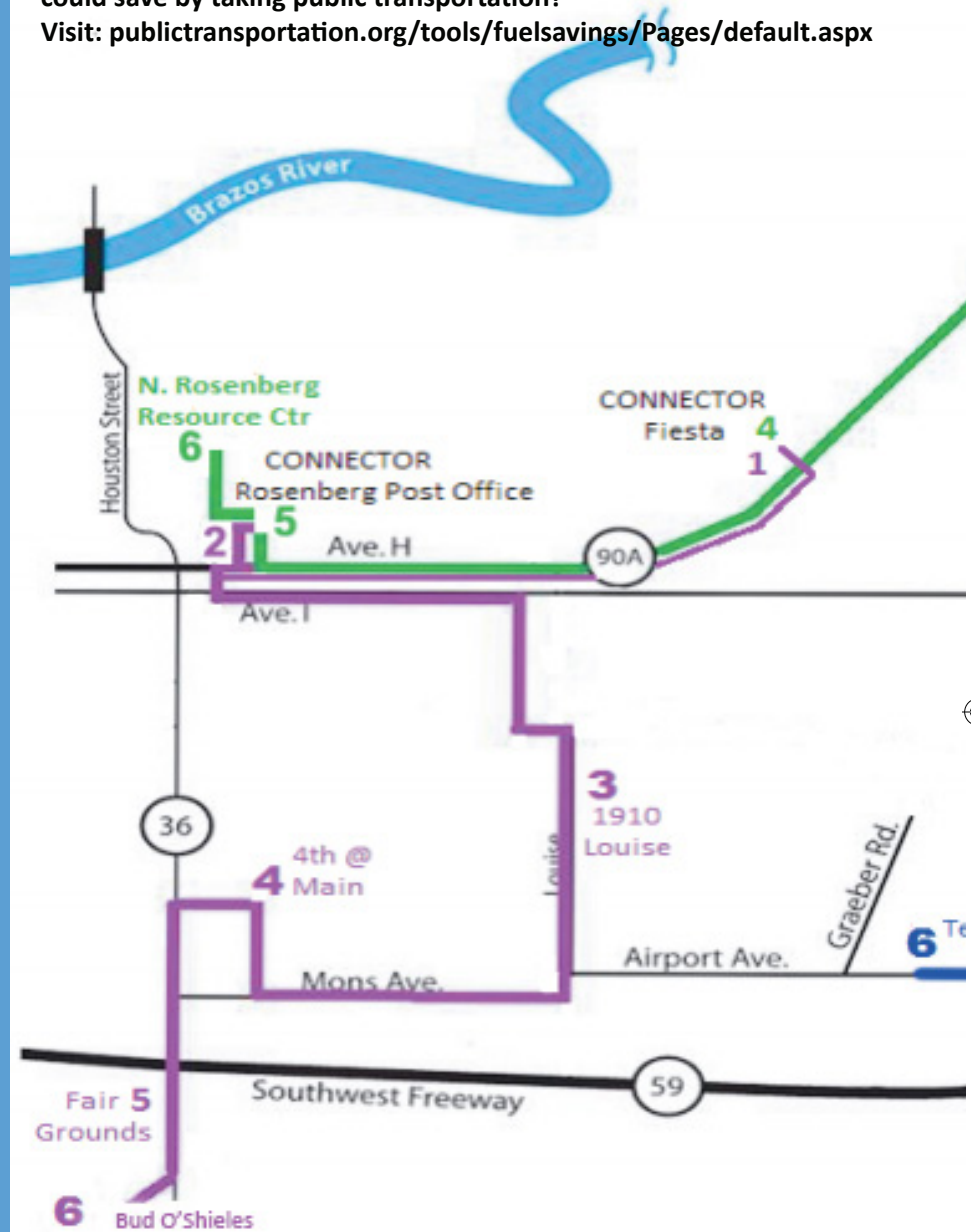

Why Not Take the Bus?

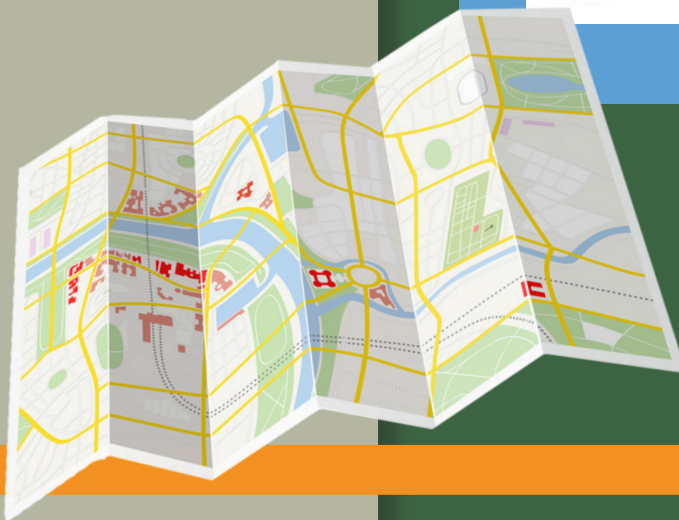

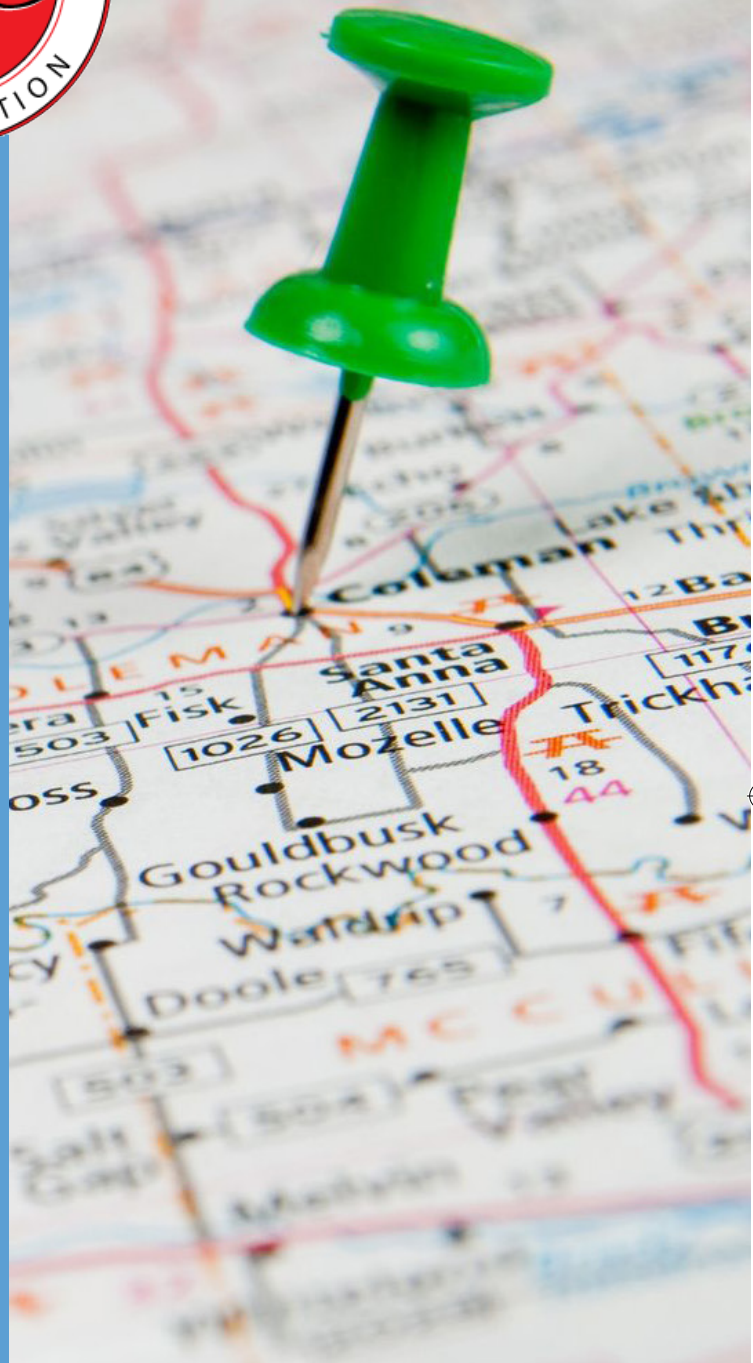


Purple Route

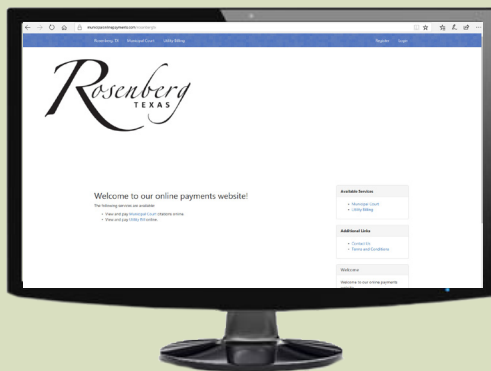


Green Route

Spring Festival Set for Downtown

The Spring Arts and Antiques Festival, put on by the City of Rosenberg Main Street Program in Historic Downtown, will be on Saturday, April 7th, 2018. There is no admission cost and no charge for the live entertainment.

The event will feature vendors, food trucks, live music, and great activities for the kids.

The portion of Third Street and Avenue G that intersects downtown will be closed off in order to allow visitors to shop, dine, and enjoy the live entertainment.

"This Spring Arts and Antiques Festival really has something for everyone," Main

Street Manager, Dan Kelleher said. "The event has really grown over the years and this year we are looking at more family-oriented entertainment including puppet shows, street entertainers, and more."

In addition to the Fine Art Receptions and antiques, there will also be a Czech Fest at Third Street Art Park, a play by CAST Theatrical Company, and tons to eat and drink.

"There are two Arts and Antiques Festivals a year," Kelleher said. "We do one in the spring and fall because they've grown to be quite popular. Its a great chance to get out and explore our Historic Downtown."
